## Part 1A

Lesson Objectives:

Perform parade movements as a flight.

1. Know the importance of Drill and Ceremony.
2. Know basic commands and characteristics of the command voice.
3. Know when and how to salute.
4. Apply and execute the concepts and principles of basic drill positions and movements.

Samples of Behavior / Main Points:

1. Execute the various marching movements.
2. Execute proper military position and place prior to parade.
3. Respond with proper military procedures for entire parade sequence.

## 1B

Strategy: Begin lesson by getting the attention of the students. The objective of this chapter is for students to know about the drill of the flight which includes information on formations and marching. Explain why this information is important to them and how it will be applied as they begin to engage in drill. Give students a clear purpose and reason for performing the movements.
